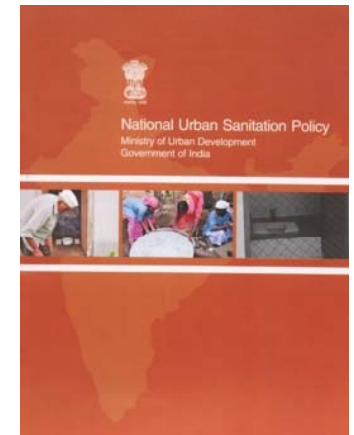
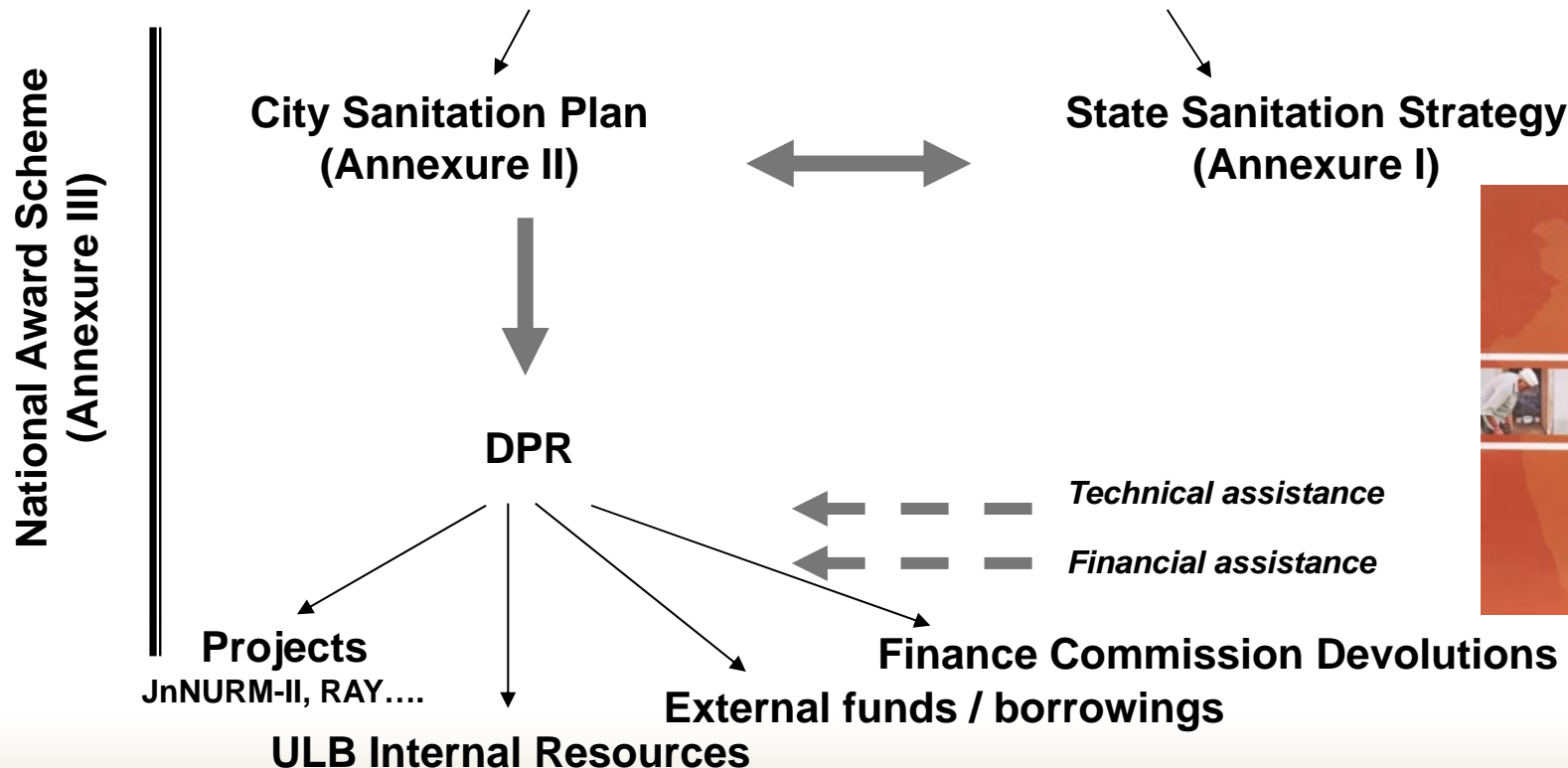

National Urban Sanitation Policy Vision

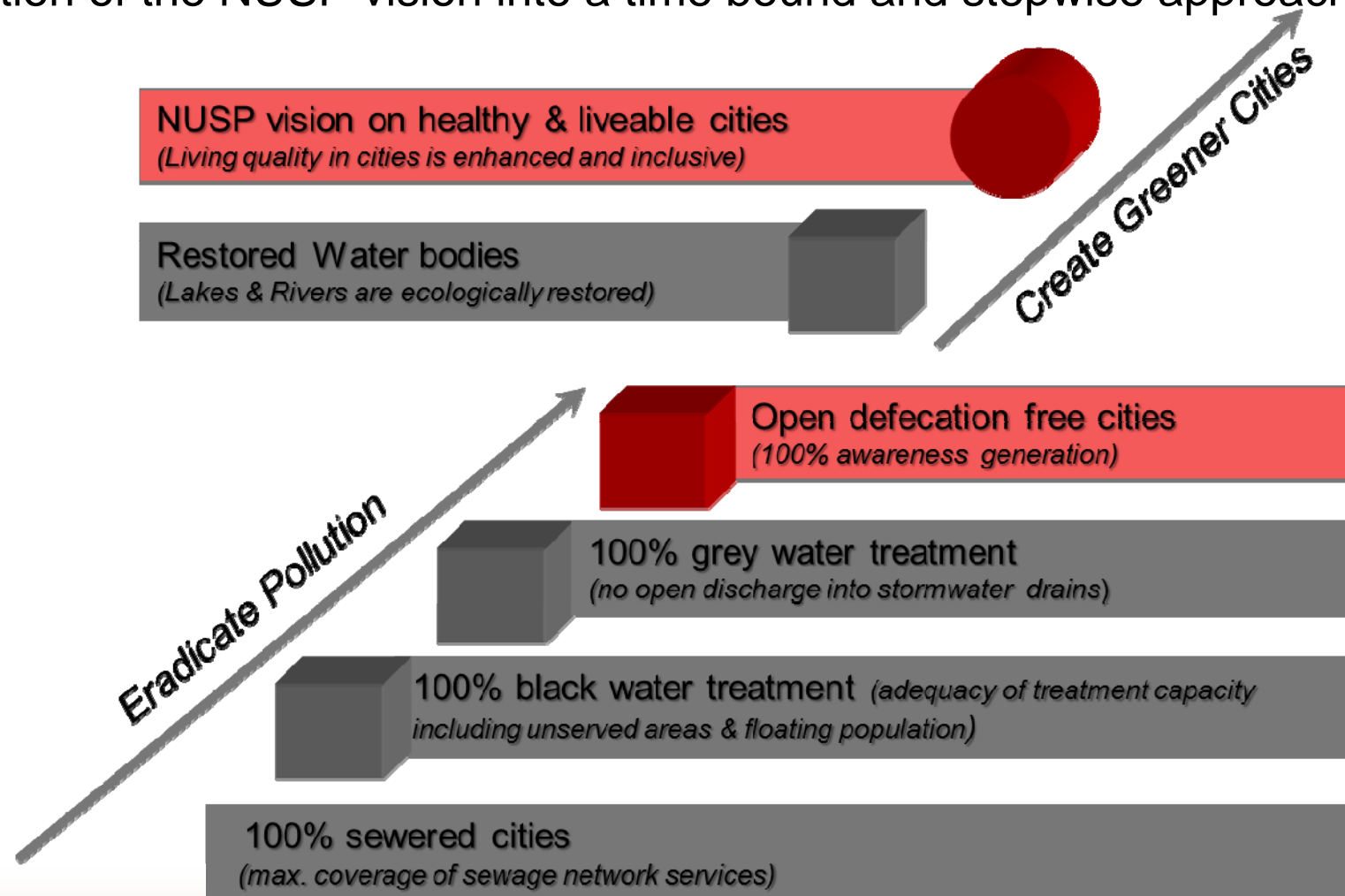

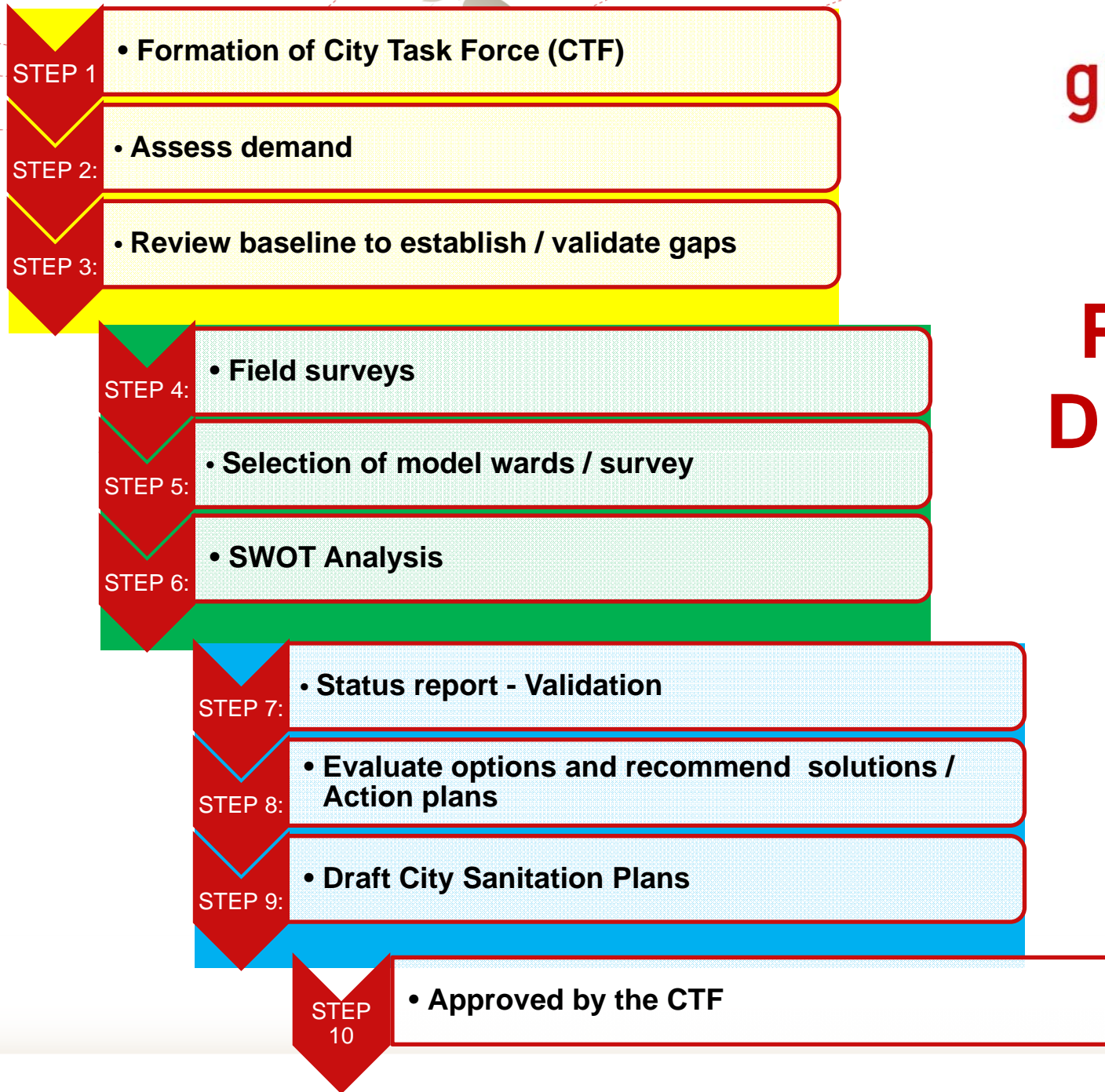

CSP - Planning Dimension



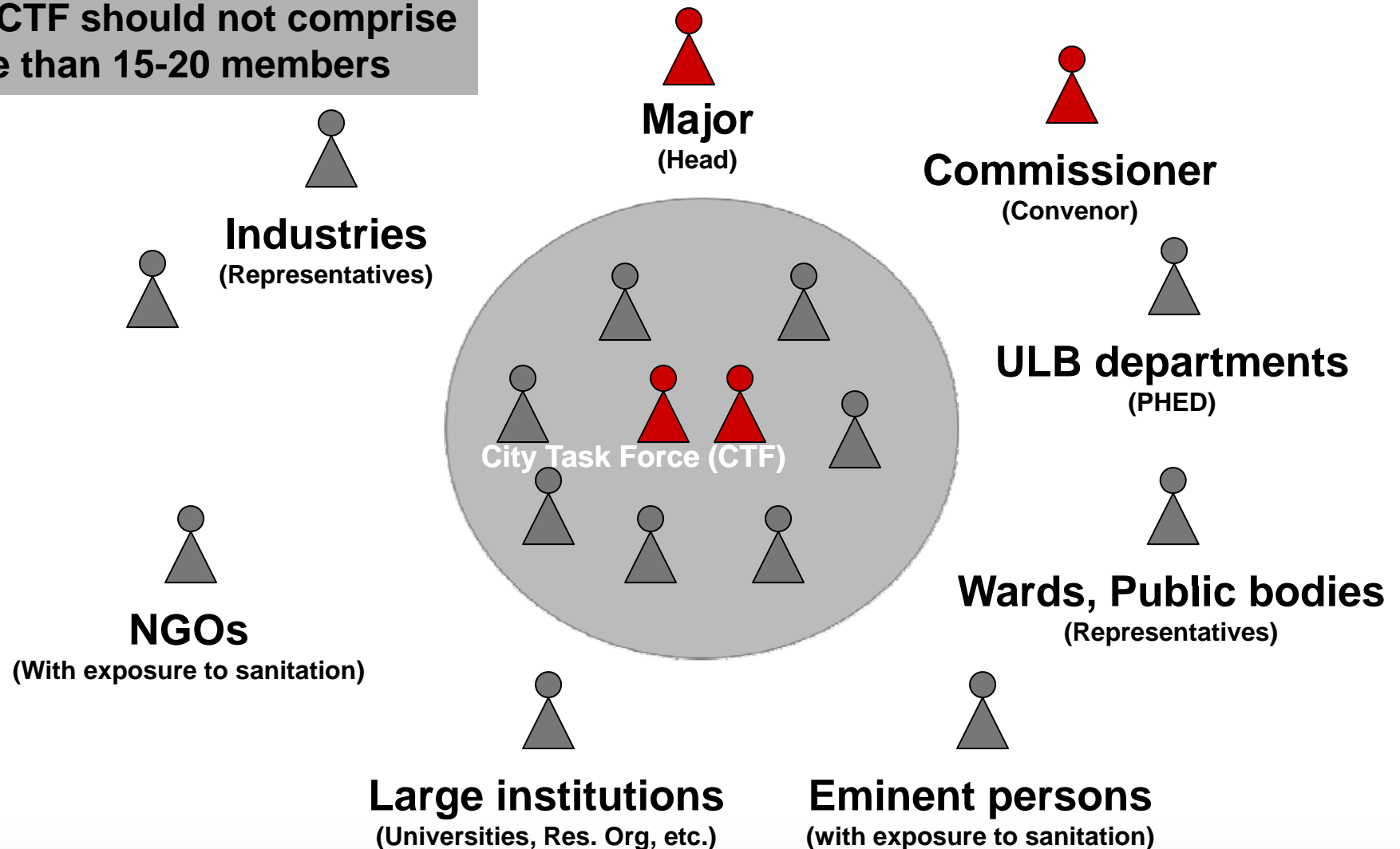

- Household/Unit level survey
- Slum survey
- Special surveys (pollution hotspots, open defecation, Public Toilets, Community Toilets)
- Ward level proposal

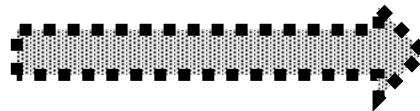

Five Strategic Dimensions of City Sanitation Plan

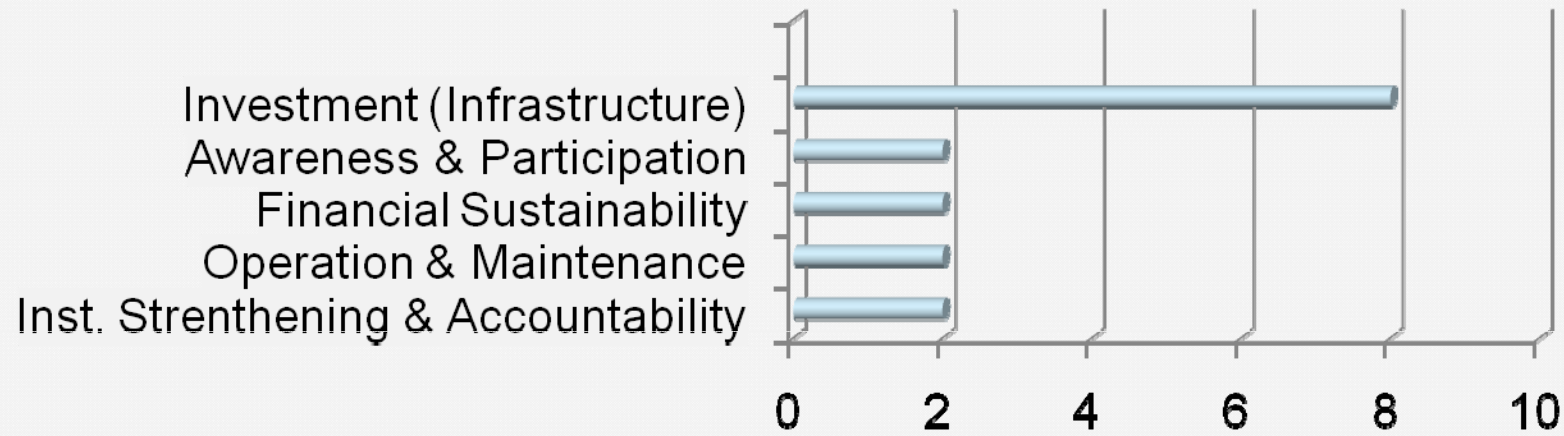

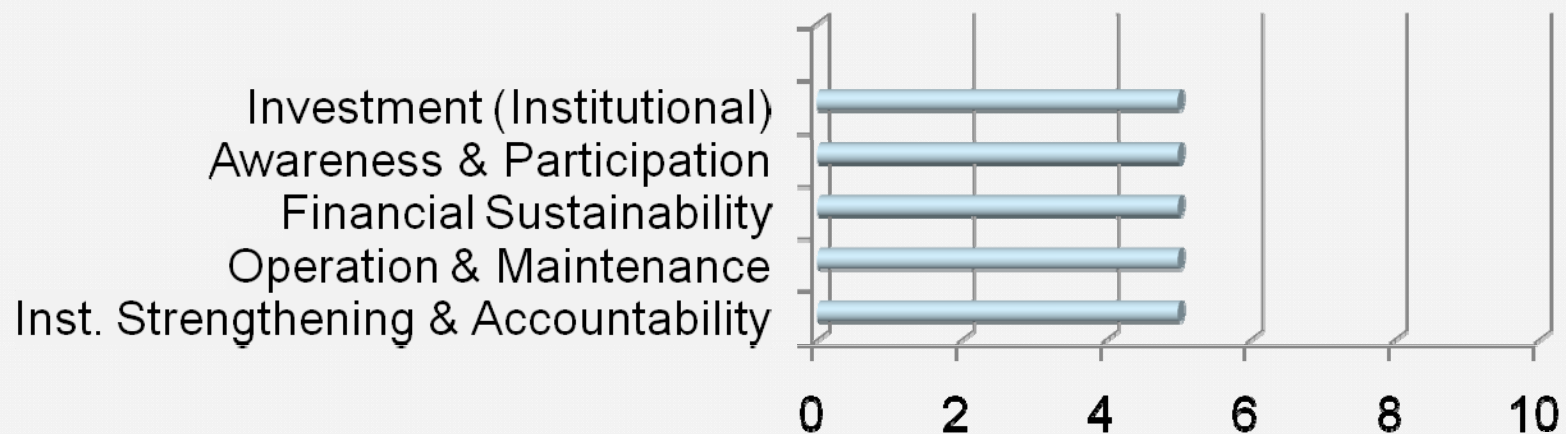

CSP implementation (suboptimal)

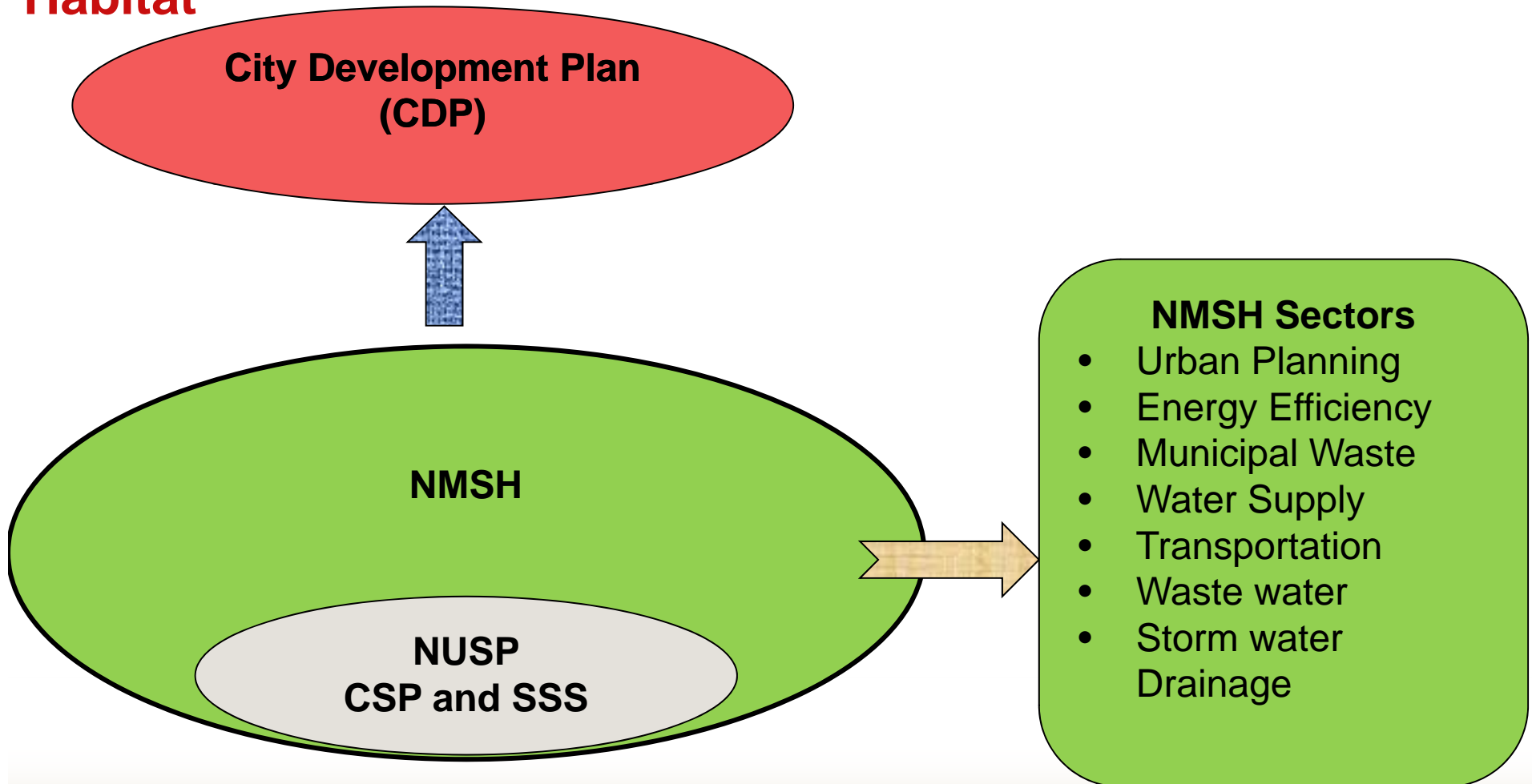


CSP Implementation (optimal)



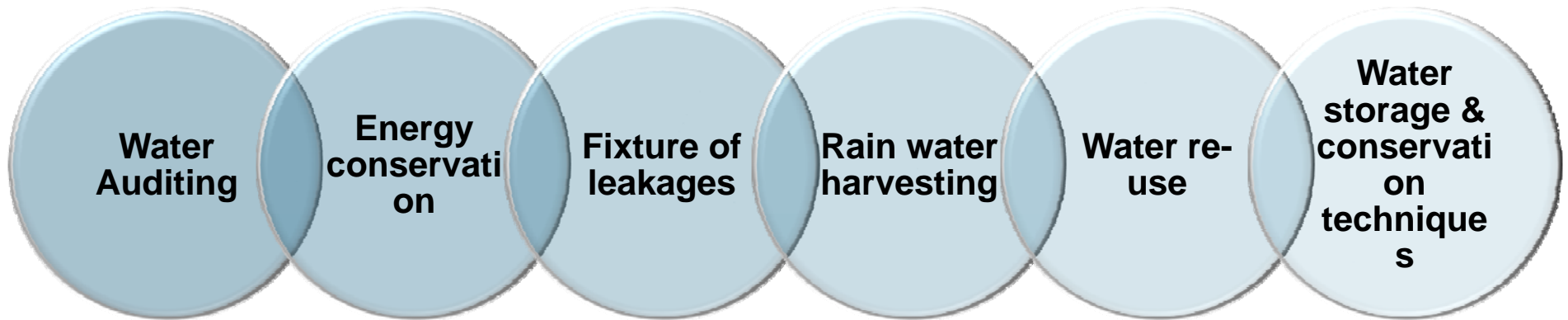

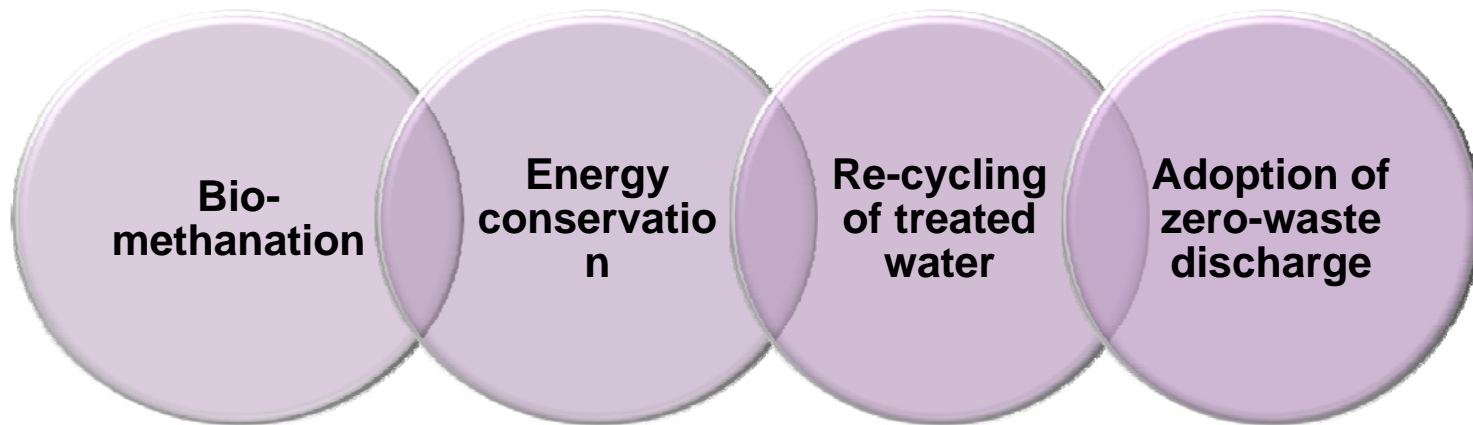

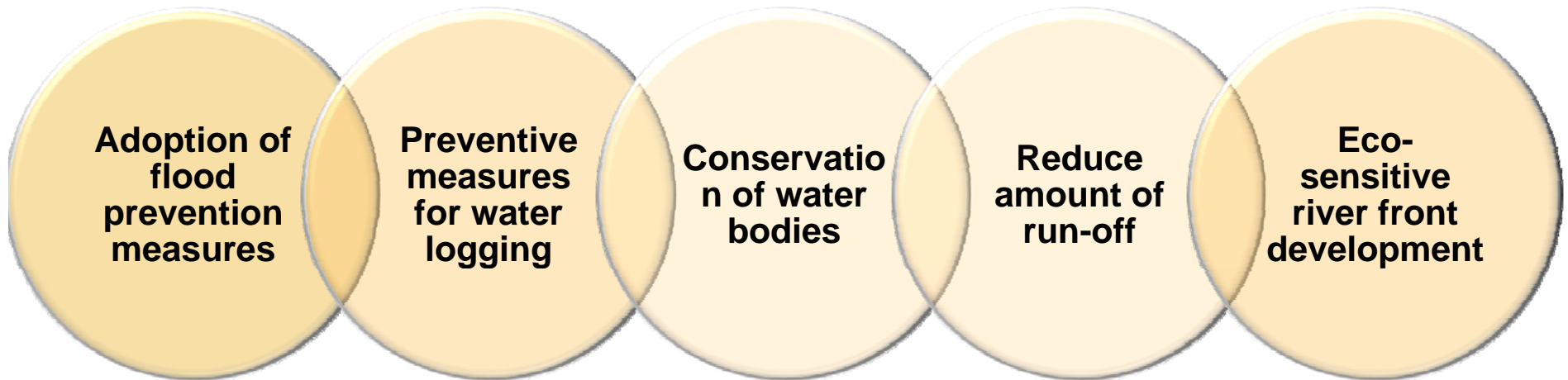


Wastewater related actions

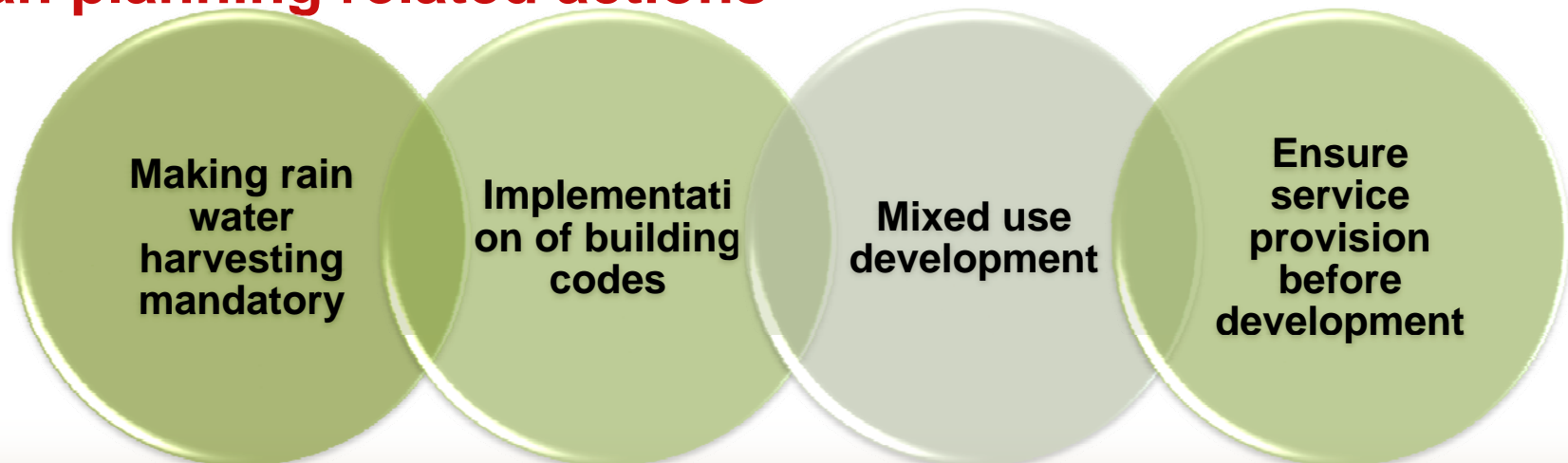




Storm water drainage related actions

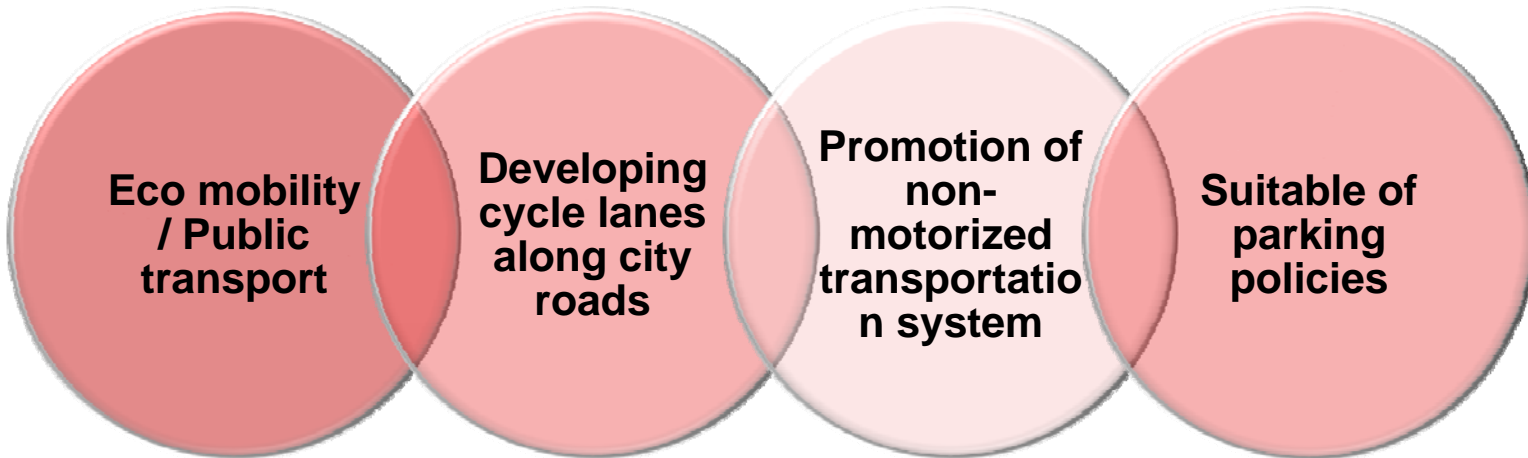

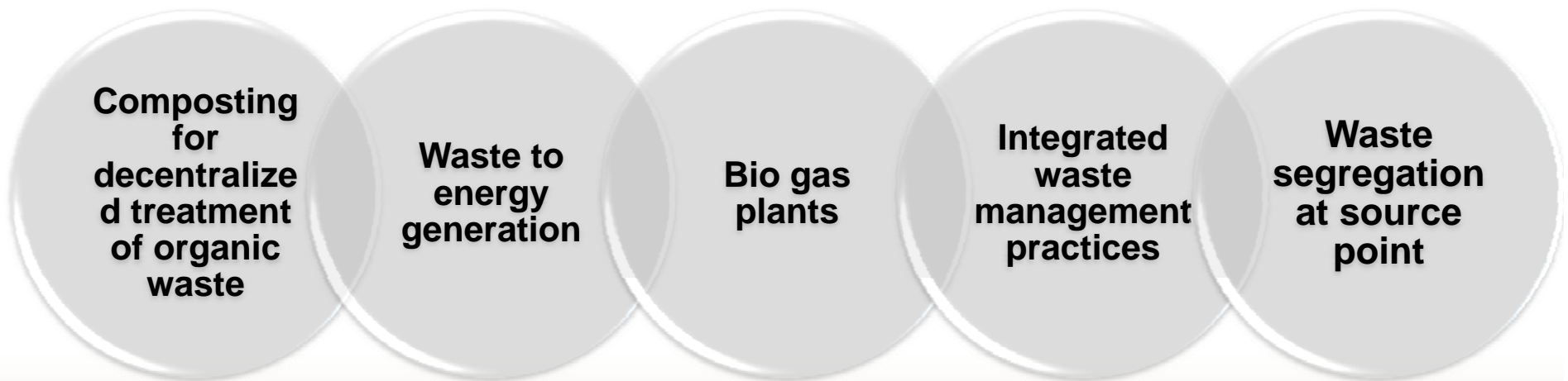

Nashik – Sustainable Urban Habitat Action Plan

Project Objectives:

- Support NMC in SUHAP preparation addressing issues on mitigation and adaptation
- Handhold the process of implementation of climate change action plans
- Building institutional capacity of NMC and MEETRA
- Enabling MEETRA to replicate the whole process to other cities in Maharashtra

Duration: April 2013 to Nov 2014

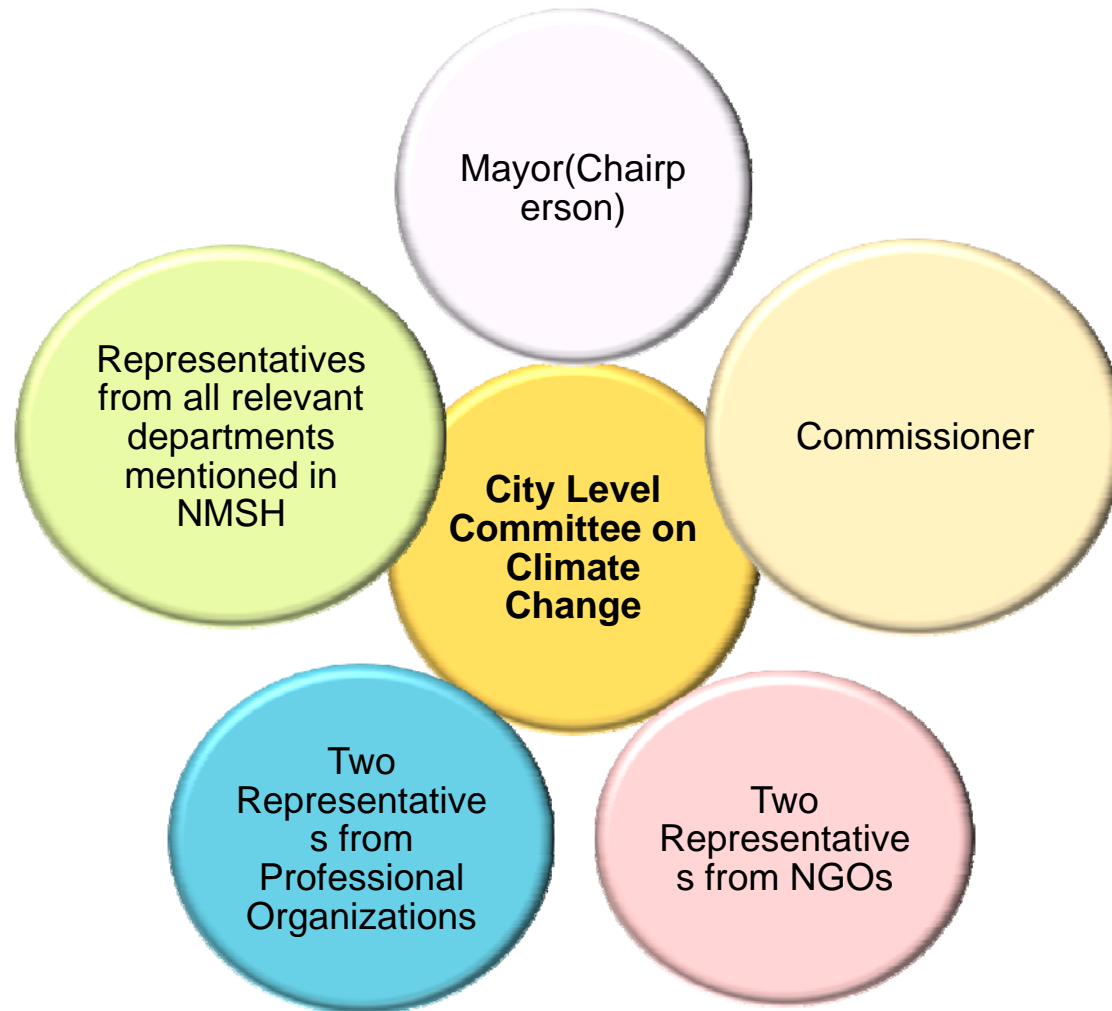


Expected outcomes

- Status report containing baseline energy consumption, GHG emissions and vulnerability assessment for the city
- Sustainable Urban Habitat Action Plan (SUHAP) for Nashik city covering:
 - Water supply
 - Urban planning
 - Urban transport
 - Solid waste management
 - Energy efficiency of buildings
 - Urban storm water drainage
- Capacity building of identified core team consisting the members from NMC & MEETRA (eg: Training on Heat + software, data collection, different adaptation tools , etc.)

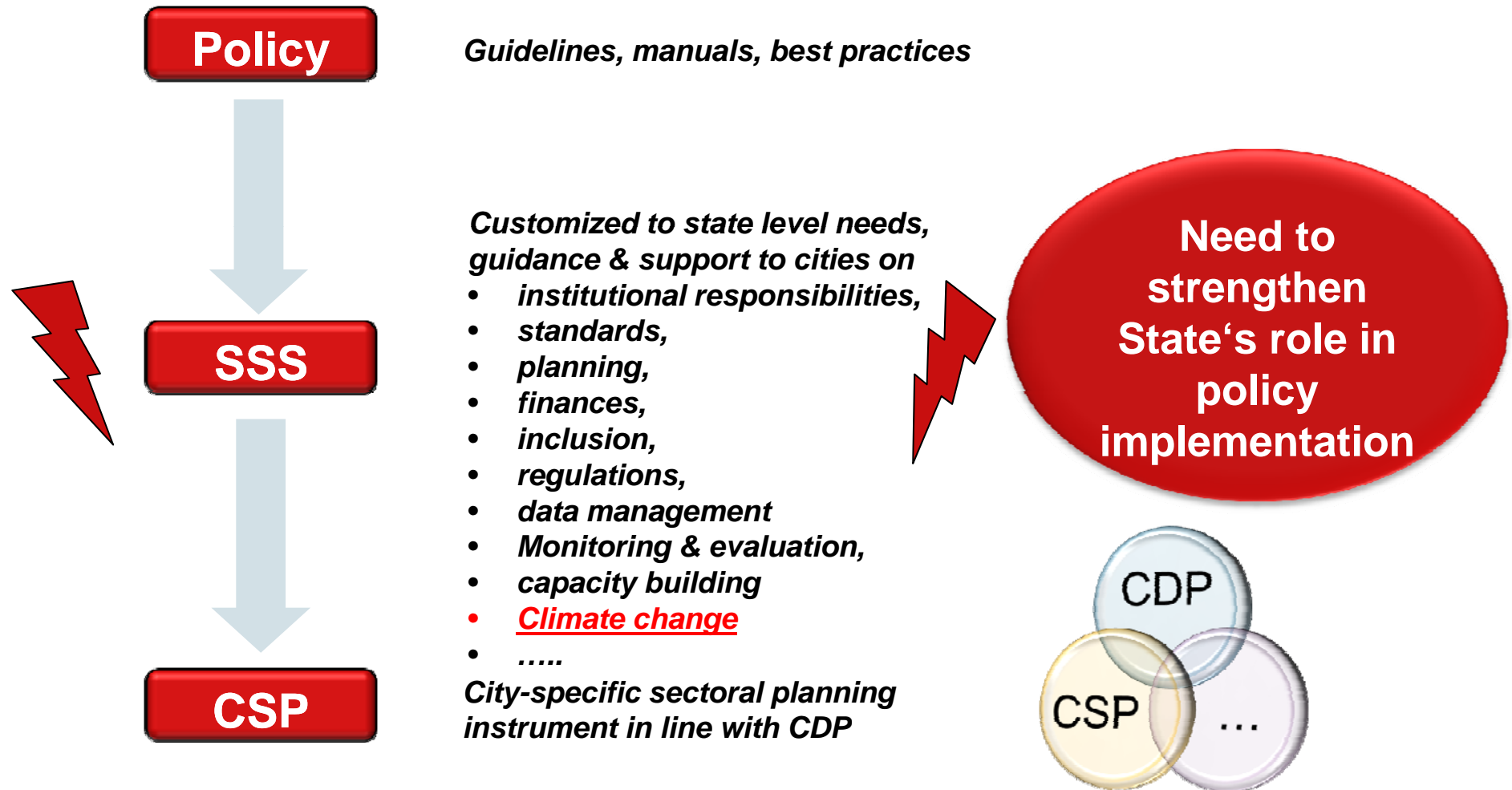

NUSP planning instruments



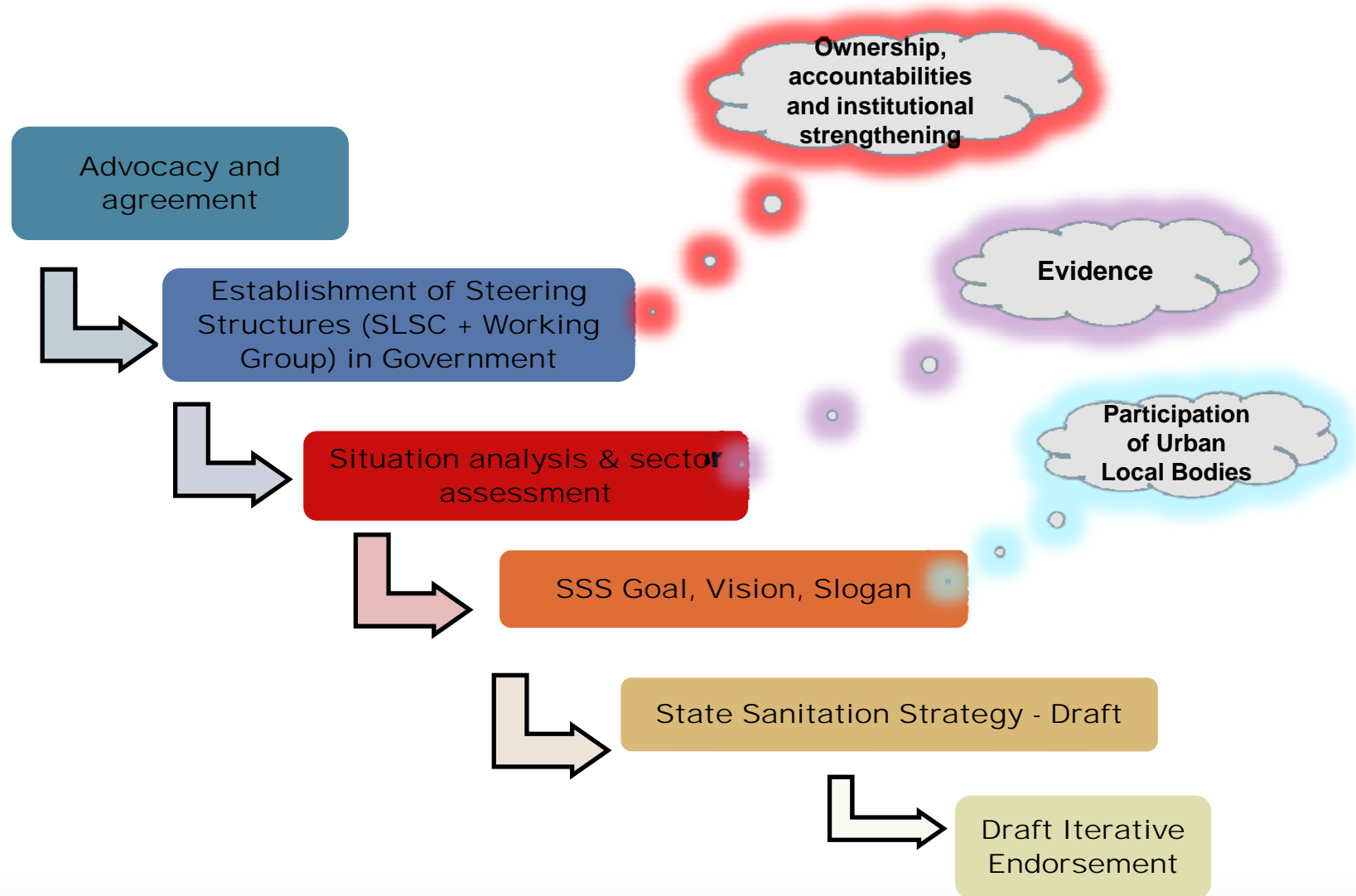


Pan - India progress on State Sanitation Strategies

- NUSP requests States to establish SSS within 2 years from 2008
- An endorsed State Sanitation Strategy / Policy still missing
- Process for policy / strategy formulation or strengthening initiated (12 of 28 states)
 - Bihar, Uttar Pradesh
 - Tamil Nadu, Karnataka
 - Tripura, Odhisa,
 - MP, Rajasthan
 - **GIZ** : Himachal Pradesh, Andhra Pradesh, Kerala and Chhattisgarh

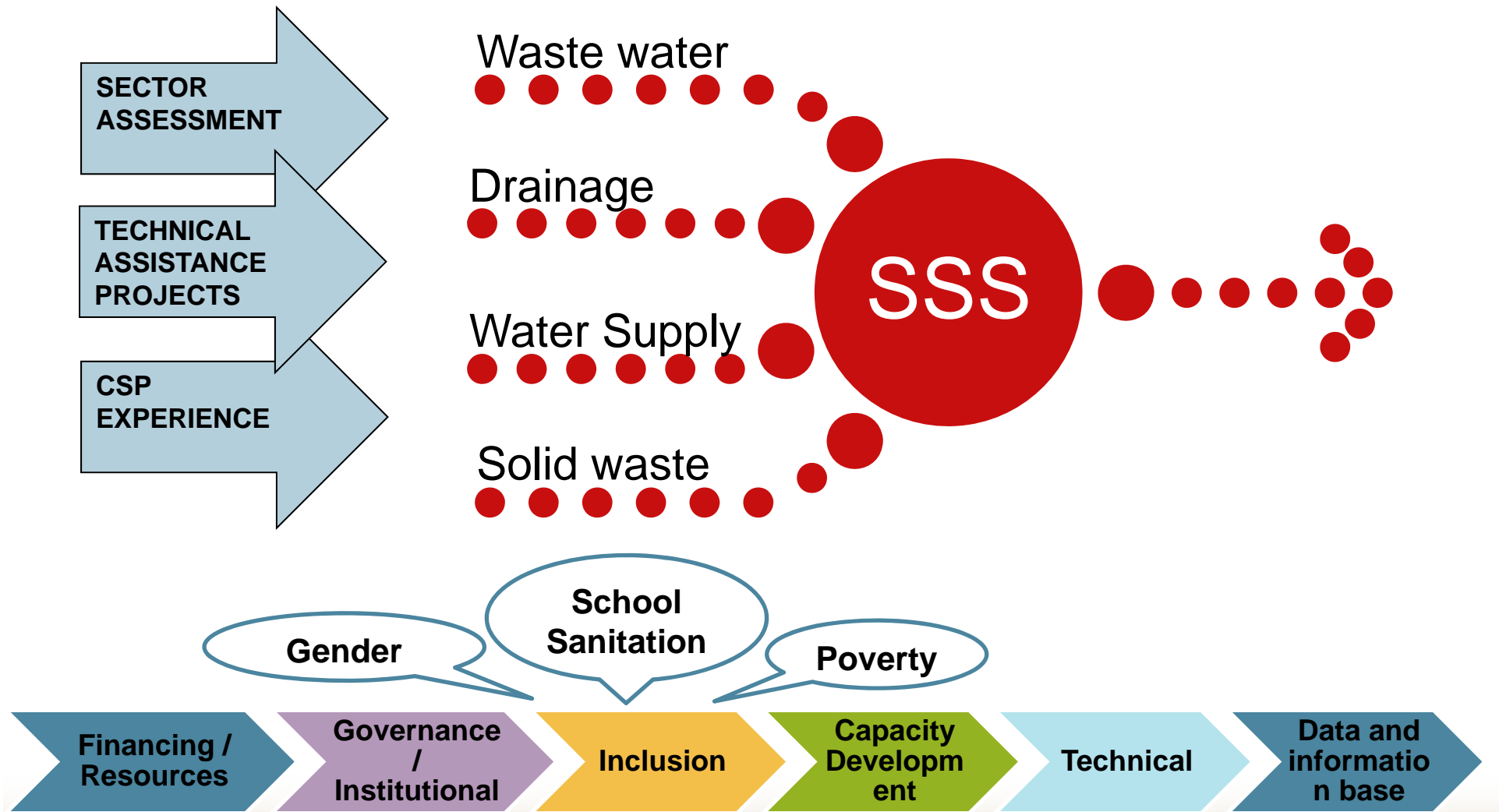


Roadmap for formulation of State Sanitation Strategies



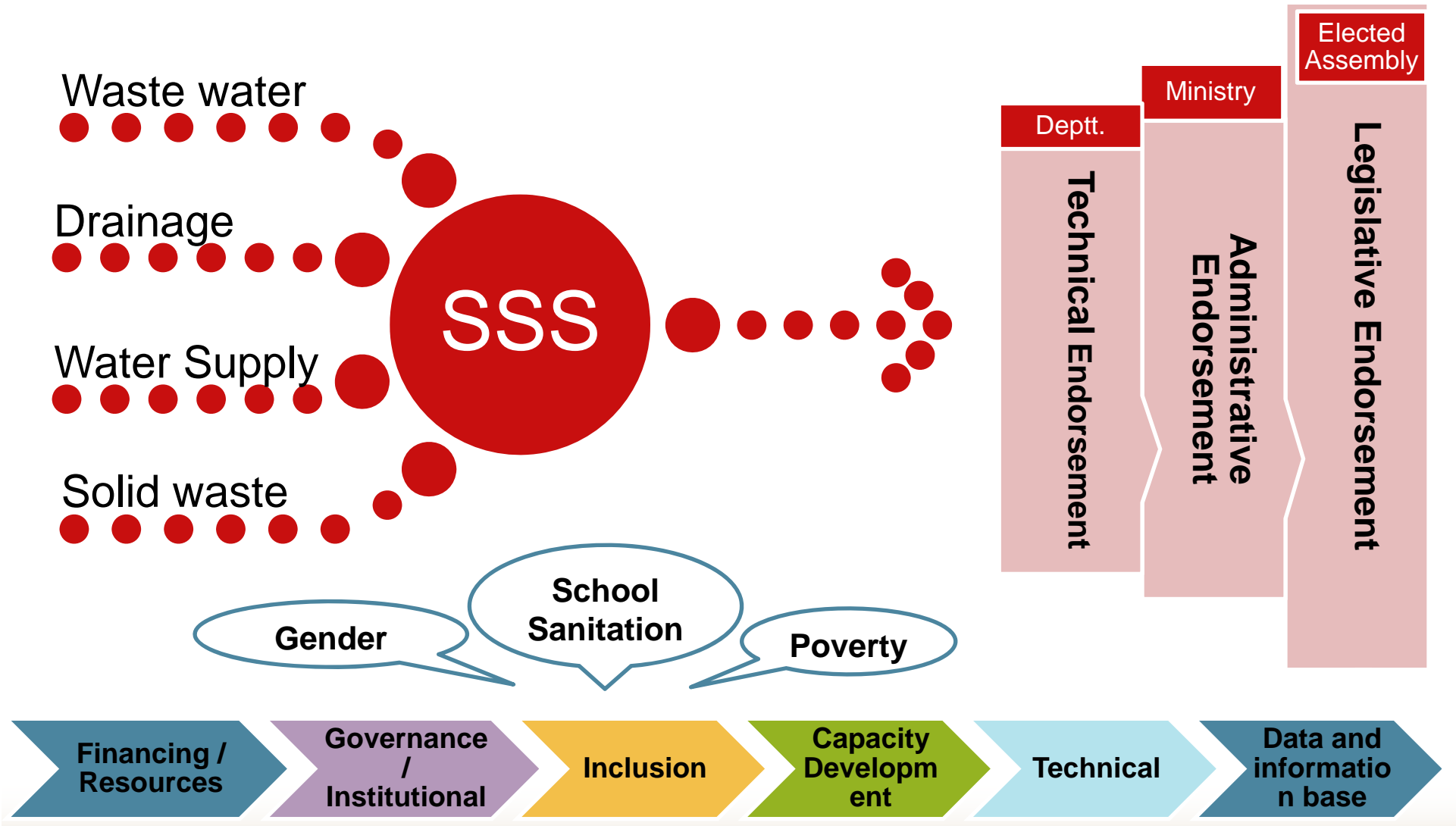
