CLIMATE MIGRANTS

- Mid 1990, 25 million migrated due to severe environmental pressure
- 2001 WDR-Redcross-25 million migrants due to disaster
- 143 million internal climate migrants by 2050 (2018 World bank)
- Prof Norman Myers, Oxford University- 200 million by 2050
- All prediction are tentative and difficult to extrapolate climate and migration data? (Prof Myers)
- Current estimate some where between 25 million to 1 billion.





CLIMATE AND MIGRATION

- Scientific basis on climate change and its impact is well established..but
- Climate Migration/ Refugees/ displacement?
- Migration triggers- Socio-economicenvironmental-Political?
- Who? Men, women, youth, children and vulnerable people
- Migration hotspots- backward, fragility, conflict
- Migration Choices- individual- family- labour market, towards Cities? Urban centre? Intrainterstate?





INDIA MIGRATION

- 450 million (Census 2011)
- 9 million annual migration for employment (Economic survey 2017)
- 100 million seasonal migrant workers
- Meager ISMWA data on interstate migration
- Informal study and research






DISASTER RISK IN INDIA

- Both slow onset and rapid onset disaster
- 27 states in India are disaster prone
- 42% of the land rain fed and 68% cultivated area are drought prone
- 12% of the area is flood prone
- 5700 KM of coastal region cyclone prone
- 15 area susceptible to land slide
- Half of the population in India are vulnerable to natural disasters




MIGRATION IN ODISHA


- Census 10 million migrants
- Inter-state migrant workers Act registration 1.5 lakh
- Informal estimate 2 million migrants
- Large migration from coastal region
- Both distress and aspiration
- Special project by government of Odisha

Key migration trigger








Key challenges
