## Features of the India Plastics Pact

- Voluntary agreement with businesses at the core
- Works outside (but supports) environmental compliance and mandatory legislation
- Platform for whole value chain to collaborate on major challenges

- Pacts do not endorse individual businesses or initiatives





2030 Targets#

100% Define a list of unnecessary or problematic plastic packaging of plastic packaging to be and items and take measures reusable, recyclable or to address them through compostable\* redesign and innovation 25% 50% of plastic packaging to be average recycled content effectively recycled across all plastic packaging

\*These would only include compostable plastics with all the following properties: a) do not leave any microplastic residue, b) used in closed-loop and controlled systems with sufficient infrastructure available or fit-for-purpose applications, and c)properly labelled as 'Home' or 'Industrial' compostable


#### Roadmap to 2030

  - lists expected challenges and identifies possible solutions for tackling these challenges.


