# WHAT IS THE TA HUB

A program funded by the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation, hosted by Cabinet EDE International, to address Urban Sanitation Challenges by putting in Practice and Mainstreaming the Citywide Inclusive Sanitation (CWIS) Approach in Programming, Design and Implementation of Projects in Sub-Saharan Africa.



## OBJECTIVE

To support a range of multilateral banks and governments by providing strategic, flexible and timely technical assistance to support the adoption of CWIS approaches in investment in Sub-Saharan Africa (SSA).



**Improve quality of project preparation and implementation:** Increase number of successful inclusive urban sanitation projects,



**Structure and strengthen** the policy, regulatory and institutional framework and facilitate service delivery improvements by adoption of the CWIS framework



**Build networks and capacity** of professionals and firms to scale up the adoption of CWIS tools and approaches in programming and project implementation

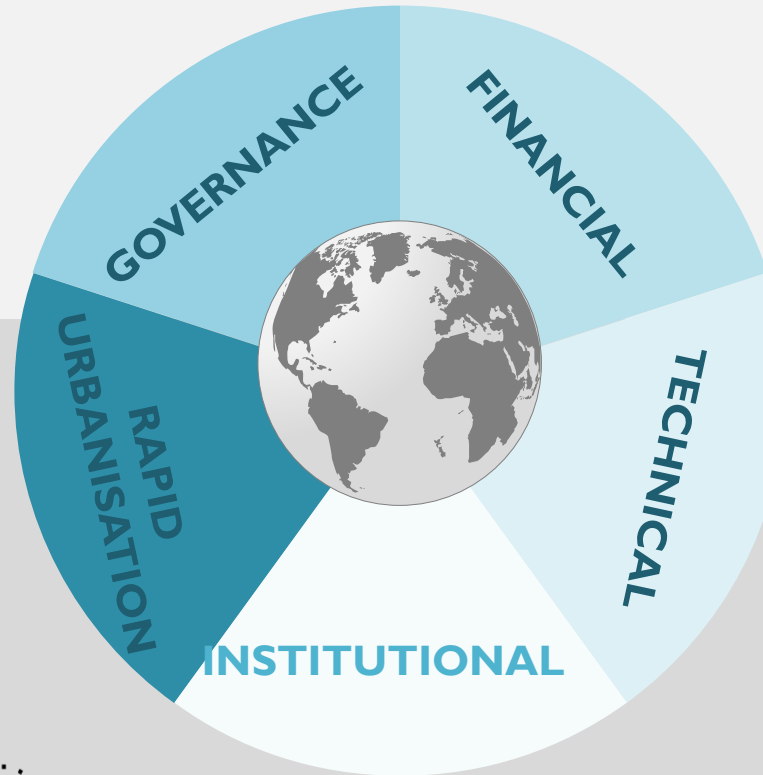
# BARRIERS TO INCLUSIVE URBAN SANITATION

- Limited political-will
- Weak policy, regulatory and enforcement mechanisms
- Inadequate public and community participation



- Limited diversification of existing and potential funding sources
- Inadequate financing for Non-sewer sanitation services that serve majority of the urban population
- Limited involvement, low incentives and inadequate enabling environment for private sector financing
- Lack of, or low-cost recovery mechanisms for urban sanitation services

- High urban population growth has significantly outpaced the capacity for infrastructure development and service delivery systems
- Rapid expansion of informal settlements and low-income communities with poor service coverage and quality is increasing urban inequalities

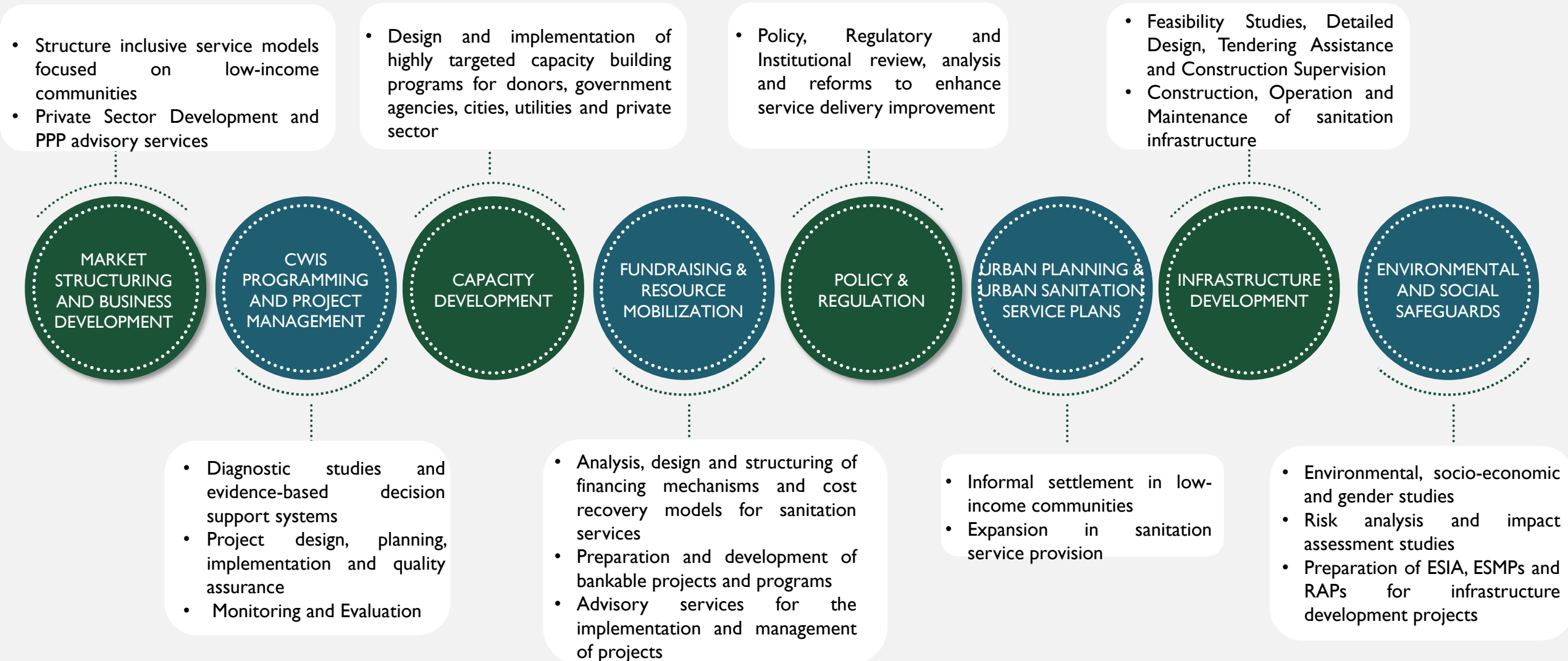


- Inadequate technical capacity
- Focus on technical and infrastructure solutions with limited prioritization of inclusive citywide services
- Limited scaling of resource recovery and end-use technologies
- Poor operation and maintenance of sanitation systems
- Poor sustainability of urban sanitation markets and businesses



- Unclear mandates, responsibilities and accountability mechanisms
- Inadequate capacity (human and financial resources) to deliver effective and efficient citywide services
- Poor coordination and integration of urban services to optimize resource efficiency

# CURRENT PROJECTS AND COUNTRIES OF INTERVENTION

## COTE D'IVOIRE

- Assessment of potential for on-site sanitation by-products
- Development of the national strategy for on-site sanitation in urban areas

## SENEGAL

Technical assistance for the development and coordination for scaling up urban sanitation services and improvement of sanitation infrastructures

## SIERRA LEONE

Technical assistance in the integration of CWIS in water supply and sanitation master plan & preparation for a medium-term investment for Freetown

## BURKINA FASO

- Inventory of Non-Sewer sanitation status for 6 cities
- FSTP design of 3 cities (Koufougou/Ouahigouya/Banfora) – technical, economical and environmental studies
- Highly targeted capacity building programs

## BENIN

Technical assistance to SGDS (Public service) to delegate FSTPs to Private Sector (operator selection, contracting and technical assistance) during the first-year operation, and valorisation of by-products

## NIGER

- Structuring of an innovative municipal sanitation market for Niamey
- Highly targeted capacity building programs

## ETHIOPIA

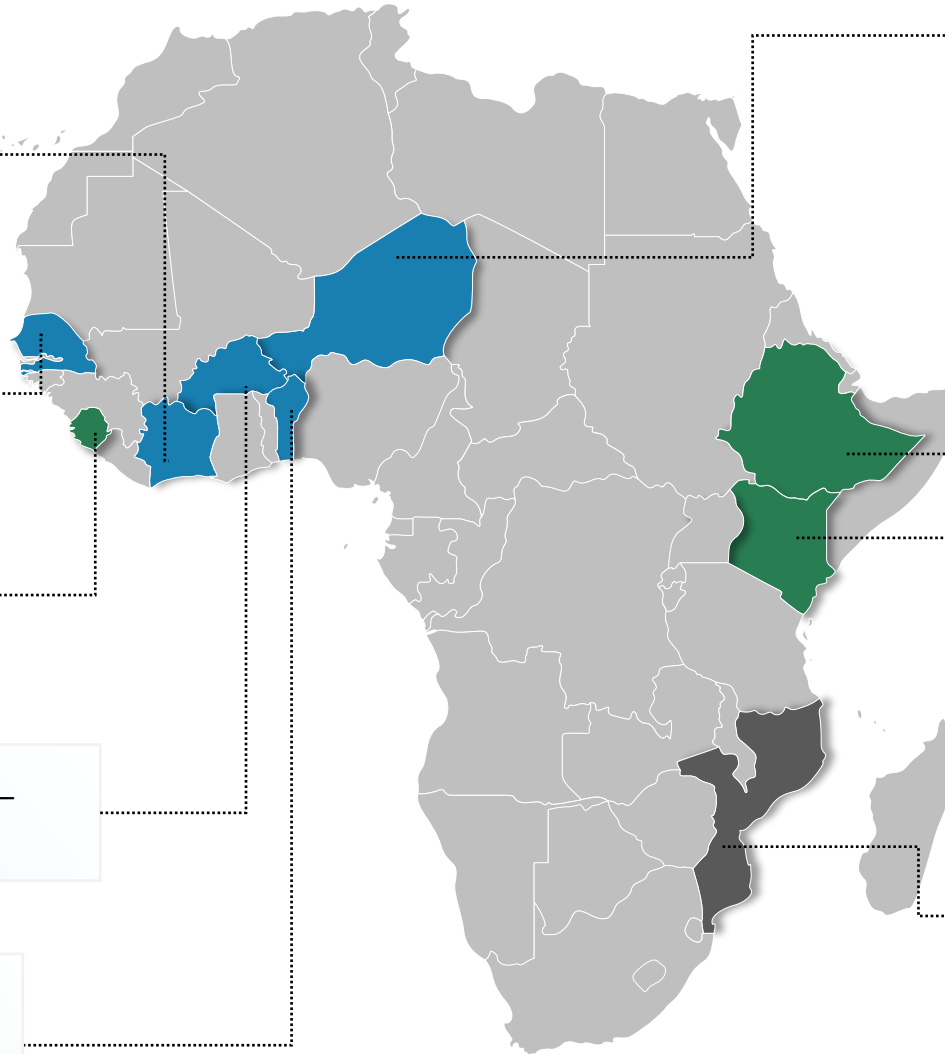
TA for participatory CWIS planning, public sector, private sector development and peer to peer learning in Hawassa including a network of 10 regional cities

## KENYA
