





- CSE in collaboration with India's Union Ministry of Environment and Forests has introduced state of the art training programmes to enhance the capacities of environmental regulators.
- The programmes are designed exclusively for SPCBs and other environmental regulatory agencies to bridge the knowledge gaps.
- CSE offers short term one-week training programmes as well as long term one month (national minimum) programmes.

CSE's collaboration with NEC, Bhutan

- CSE collaborated with NEC, Bhutan, by signing a MoU on May 7, 2012 in Paro, Bhutan.
- CSE has prepared Environment Assessment (EA)
 guidelines for eight sectors in Bhutan industry, forest,
 roads & highways, hydropower, mining, tourism,
 transmission lines and an EA for 'general' sectors.
- Trained over 350 NEC and other regulatory officials in Bhutan on EIA, inspection and monitoring.
- Prepared guidelines for vehicle washing facilities for NEC
- Conducted inspections of Pasakha industrial estate, near Phuentsholing at the India-Bhutan border.



CSE's collaboration with DoE, Bangladesh

- The association of Centre for Science and Environment (CSE) with DoE, MoEF, Bangladesh started in 2008.
- In 2009 CSE prepared sector specific EIA guidelines for Coal Mining, Pharmaceutical, Textile and Cement sector.
- CSE drafted the new EIA Rules for Bangladesh
- Trained more than 300 regulators and industry officers on EIA and waste management in different sectors



CKDu study in the north central region in Sri Lanka, 2012

- Ministry of Water Supply and Drainage requested CSE to undertake water quality tests to understand the widespread reports of CKDu (Chronic Kidney Disease of Unknown Etiology) in the north central region of Sri Lanka.
- The study involved testing samples of water, soil, grains, pesticides and fertilizer collected from the key affected areas
- The findings were released in Anuradhapura at a public meeting chaired by Sri Lanka's minister for water supply and drainage, Dinesh Gunawardene.



Radiation Studies across South Asia

 The impact of mobile tower radiation has been mentioned worldwide, including the recent WHO report

 CSE has thus taken an initiative to benchmark the radiation standards across South Asia
