Training on Nature-Based Solutions for Water and Waste Management

Mainstreaming Decentralised Approach

Date: July 10-13, 2018



The Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and International Water Association (IWA) recommends integration of the urban water cycle, including water supply, wastewater, storm water and groundwater management for creating water wise cities. The national missions such as Smart City, AMRUT and HRIDAY have identified water access and augmentation, wastewater treatment, septage management and reuse as major components of the mission. Achieving these missions would not be possible without understanding the nature based solutions.

This training programme is being organised by the School of Water and Waste, Centre for Science and Environment and it will focus on the components of Water Sensitive Urban Design and Planning (WSUDP) — designing urban rainwater harvesting (RWH), sustainable urban drainage system (SuDS) and wastewater recycle and reuse, with a focus on green infrastructure options. At the end of the training, participants will develop skills to manage available local water resources in a sustainable way by integrating it into the planning and designing of cities. Registration to this training is on first come first basis.
