Protection of Water

- *Water as both Right and Commodity*
- *Reduce duration of water supply*
- *Charge more for industrial use*
- *Ban water-intensive industries*
- *Make treatment plants compulsory*
- *Make National Water Policy & State Water Policy public & functional*
- *Subsidies for recycling and reuse*
- *Need for convergent efforts*

Protection of Water Resources

Puducherry Water Policy states that in the planning and operation of systems, water allocation priorities will be broadly as follows:

1. Drinking Water
2. Irrigation
3. Industries
4. Ecology
5. Navigation
6. Power

But Tourism seems to surpass everything.
